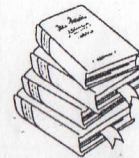

ABOUT THE EDITORS

Elizabeth Podnieks, EdD, RN, is Professor at Ryerson University, School of Nursing in Toronto and Chair of ONPEA. She conducted the National Survey on Abuse of the Elderly in Canada in 1991 and is a pioneer in elder abuse work in faith communities and raising awareness of elder abuse among children and adolescents. Dr. Podnieks has published extensively in the area of elder abuse and neglect, and has presented at numerous conferences, workshops, and scientific and educational meetings at both national and international levels. Included in the many conferences she has chaired and organized was the Second National Conference on Elder Abuse held in Toronto in 1999. She was the coordinator for Canada on the World Health Organization (WHO) International network for the Prevention of Elder Abuse (INPEA) global response to elder abuse, Vice-President of the INPEA, and a founding member of the Canadian Network for the Prevention of Elder Abuse (CNPEA). She was co-chair with Minister Cam Jackson on the Provincial Elder Abuse Round Table. Dr. Podnieks was awarded the Order of Canada for her work in the field of Elder Abuse in 2001.

Jordan I. Kosberg, PhD, ACSW, has been The University of Alabama Endowed Chair of Social Work since 1999. He has taught at numerous universities in the United States and has been a Visiting Professor at Nankai University in Tianjin, China, at Hong Kong University, at City University of Hong Kong, and was the 2002 Visiting TOWER Fellow of the New Zealand Institute for Research on Ageing at Victoria University of Wellington. He is a Fellow of The Gerontological Society of America (GSA) and of the Association for Gerontology in Higher Education (AGHE). Dr. Kosberg is editor or co-editor of six books, and author or co-author of 25 book chapters and over 100 journal articles. Dr. Kosberg is the Co-Principle Investigator for two research projects on

family care giving funded by the National Institute on Aging and the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality. He is former Board Member for the Association for Gerontology in Higher Education-Social Work (AGE-SW) and was awarded the Association's Career Achievement Award in 2000. He had been a member of the Board of Directors (representing the U.S.A. Region) for the International Network for the Prevention of Elder Abuse (a U.N. designated NGO).

Ariela Lowenstein, PhD, is Associate Professor and Head of the Department of Aging Studies-Master's in Gerontology, and the Center for Research and Study of Aging at the Faculty of Welfare and Health Studies, the University of Haifa, Israel. Dr. Lowenstein is considered one of the leading national and international experts in the field of aging. She has published extensively in several journals, chapters in books, monographs, and training manuals, and is co-editor of the books *Global Aging and the Family* and *The Need for Theory in Gerontology*. She serves as a research fellow at the Israeli Institute for Social Policy and the Herczeg Institute for the Study of Aging at Tel-Aviv University, Israel, and also as an honorary fellow of the American Gerontological Society. She has extensive research collaboration with scholars from the U.S., Canada, and Europe and also serves on various Israeli governmental and local agencies as a consultant, member of various national committees and an advisor for policy planning. Dr. Lowenstein's research areas include intergenerational family relations, theory building in gerontology, grandparenthood, family care giving, elders' quality of life, elder abuse, gerontological education, policy development in aging, and service evaluation.

Foreword

I am honored to have been invited to pen this foreword for the special collection entitled *Elder Abuse: Selected Papers from the Prague World Congress on Family Violence*.

Nothing that I might say can assuage the grief we have all felt at the loss of Gerry Bennett or the regret at the cancellation of the World Congress on Family Violence in Prague due to the "perfect storm" of international events—terrorism, SARS, and the Iraq war.

This special volume contains what would have been the presentations by a distinguished expert international faculty at the groundbreaking Elder Abuse Symposium in Prague, an international event dedicated to Gerry Bennett in recognition of his humanity, his spirit, and his leadership.

Those who had the privilege of knowing Gerry are aware of how much he cared about his work and his profession. His was a strong voice for the international effort to prevent family violence and especially elder abuse as General Secretary of the International Network for the Prevention of Elder Abuse (INPEA).

At the First World Conference on Family Violence in Singapore in 1998, I made a personal commitment to Gerry and to Rosalie Wolfe that elder abuse would be fully represented at any future World Congress. As Elizabeth Podnieks has written, "I greatly enjoyed the conference in Singapore but was concerned over the paucity of data on elder abuse." I believe Gerry felt that the commitment was kept. He played an active
